As before, to help you do this, I have prepared a sheet for you to complete. You can either do so in word and send it back to me or you can print it out, fill it in by hand and send back an image of it. If neither of these are possible, you need to e-mail me a summary of how you have got on. When we return to school you should have a version of both reflection sheets in your book, so that we can use them to inform what intervention is required.

You have up until Friday 17th July to return this to me in some form. (if you need more time, please let me know – I do not want to have chase you!) Believe it or not I have not received all of the Reflection sheets from Summer 1 yetif you are feeling guilty at this point, it is OK to send me both by the 17th!

A couple of comments:

- The marks for the work on the sheets are slightly crazy. 1 mark is given for each question or part of question. This is unrealistic but will give me a flavour of how many you were able to complete correctly.
- **You should be familiar with RAG rating**, write R (for Red – Help!), A (for Amber – feeling OK) and G (for Green – all good). **Please DO NOT colour in the cells** as I will print out in Black and White. **You may wish to RAG rate and add a comment AFTER you have done the final assignment.**

So, as the comment above suggests it is now time for the **Final Assignment of this year**. It is set on **mathswatch** and should take **1 ½ hours** to complete, but does not have to be done in one go. It covers all of the topics we have covered in the second half of the summer term.

If you have now completed everything, including a good selection of questions from the on-line text book, the Final assignment and returned the completed sheet below, then it is time for a well-earned break from maths!

If you are not as up to date as you would like to be, then you have the summer holiday to get yourself on top of things, ready for September.
